INTRODUCTION

The County of Essex is the recipient of \$43,151.48 grant awarded under the 2022 State of New Jersey Body Armor Replacement Fund (BARF) Program. An award ACH transfer is sent directly to the County of Essex. It is the intention of the County of Essex to use these funds for the procurement of replacement body armor vests which are designed to be worn by employees of the Essex County Department of Corrections for protection against blunt force trauma resulting from the impact of a fire arm projectile, knife or other pointed weapon.

RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that the Board of Commissioners approve the insertion of these funds into the 2023 County Budget allocated for the Department of Corrections.

REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION

The approval of these funds will allow the Departments mentioned above to acquire more effective replacement body armor for Corrections Officers whose existing body armor may be reaching the end of its warranty life and effectiveness. This will help increase the safety of law enforcement personnel and reduce their exposure to bodily harm or serious injury while performing their duties.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact or matched funds requirements for the County.

ALTERNATIVE

There are no alternatives for the use of these funds.

An electronic transfer of funds or an award check has been sent directly to your agency's Chief Financial Officer.

The State BARF Program assists all eligible law enforcement agencies to offset the costs of purchasing body vests for their officers. Although this is a five-year vest replacement program, program regulations encourage agencies to make every reasonable effort to expend their awards within one year of receipt.
