DEPARTMENT OF PARKS, RECREATION AND CULTURAL AFFAIRS – APPROVAL OF SUBGRANT AGREEMENTS FOR 2023 LOCAL HISTORY PROGRAM GRANT WITH THE NEW JERSEY HISTORICAL COMMISSION – AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED - \$72,500.00

WHEREAS, the County of Essex acting through the Department of Parks, Recreation & Cultural Affairs, proposes to provide a variety of Historical programs and events (the "Services") for Essex County residents under the County's Local History Program Grant and proposes to enter into subgrant agreements for the provision of such Services with the subgrantees set forth in the schedule attached hereto to provide the Services for the contract period January 1, 2023 through December 30, 2023 and in the amounts set fort on said schedule which total subgrant amount will not exceed \$45,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer has certified the availability of funds to pay such contracts which certification is attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners is empowered by N.J.S.A. 40A:41A 38(n) to approve, by resolution, contracts presented by the County Executive, now, therefore; be it.

1. That the County Executive is authorized to enter into sub grant agreements for the Services under the 2023 Local History Program Grant in accordance with the schedule attached hereto and made a part hereof.

RE: **Request approval of sub-grant agreements in the amount of \$72,500.00 for FY23 Local History Program Grant with the New Jersey Historical Commission.**

INTRODUCTION

The Essex County Division of Cultural and Historic Affairs has been awarded a grant in the amount of \$72,500.00 from the New Jersey Historical Commission (NJHC) for its 2023 Local History Grant Program. These funds were previously inserted. It is recommended the County grant awards to twelve community based non-profit organizations to provide history programming under the Local History Program funded through grant monies from the New Jersey Historical Commission.

REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION

The local grants in the amount of \$67,500.00 will fund grant awards to twelve non-profit organizations, provide Essex County residents accessibility to local history, and foster high quality, diverse educational history programming for local communities. Of the award, \$5,000.00 will cover administration costs, compensating the peer panel for the grant review.

FISCAL IMPACT

Of the \$72,500.00 awarded by the State, \$67,500.00 will be re-granted to twelve non-profit history organizations. In addition, \$5,000.00 of funding will fund grant administration. There is no match requirement for these portions of the award.

CONCLUSION

As administrator of the Local History Program Grant, the Division promotes and rewards exemplary scholarship and influences the development of quality history programs in the County. The Division is granted the opportunity to encourage expanded public and private support for the local history community and to increase public accessibility.
